It all begins with really listening to Jesus, and then letting him love the world through us. As we move closer to the holiday of Pentecost – the day the Holy Spirit was given to the disciples - can you hear the Spirit of Christ speaking today?

Library News

We have all three of Swedish author *Fredrik Backman's* international bestsellers:



- **A MAN CALLED OVE** – A heartwarming tale about a cranky old man called “the bitter neighbor from hell.” Ove (pronounced Oh-VEH) doesn’t smile. He’s opinionated, set in his ways and thinks he’s surrounded by idiots. But no one knows about the pain and loss in his life. Everything begins to change when a couple with two little girls move in next door and accidentally flatten Ove’s mailbox with their U-Haul trailer. This book is hilarious, and sometimes sad. You’ll laugh, and you might cry.
- **MY GRANDMOTHER ASKED ME TO TELL YOU SHE’S SORRY** – Elsa is going on 8. She’s smarter than most kids her age but life is difficult. She’s bullied at school. Her parents are divorced. Her only real friend is her 77-year-old “Granny,” who tells her strange “fairy tales.” Granny is described in one review as “loony as a bat” but she dearly loves the child. When Granny dies, Elsa is left with a series of letters that send her on a journey that suggests the fairy tales are true. *Kirkus Reviews* calls this one “A touching, sometimes-funny, often wise portrait of grief.”
- **BRITT-MARIE WAS HERE** – This is the story of a 63-year-old woman who finds a happy new life after walking out of a loveless 40-year marriage. Now on her own, Britt-Marie finds a job as caretaker of a rundown small-town’s recreation center where she meets a fascinating cast of characters. She spends much of her time with noisy boys and girls and catches the eye of a policeman named Sven, who is obviously smitten with her. Britt-Marie soon finds

herself doing something she never dreamed of -- coaching a youth soccer team. She becomes a pillar of the community in a journey that illustrates “the unexpected friendships we make that teach us who we really are and the things we are capable of doing.”

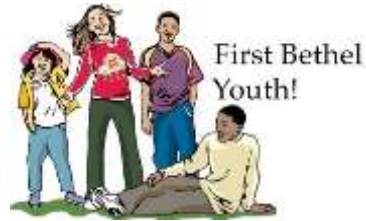
Fill Your Bucket!
