The Hebrew prophet Isaiah wrote a beloved passage that has become closely associated with Christmas:

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them has light shined.

<sup>6</sup>For unto us a child is born, unto us a son given to us; all authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:2, 6-7)

One of my favorite writers is Howard Thurman, the great African-American author, philosopher, theologian, educator, and civil rights leader. He was the Dean of the Chapel at both Howard University in Washington DC and Boston University. His theology of nonviolence helped Thurman become a legendary mentor to the likes of Martin Luther King, and every Advent my mind goes back to his words about candlelight and Christmas which seem so very precious and timely right now.

"I will light candles this Christmas, Candles of joy despite all the sadness, Candles of hope where despair keeps watch, Candles of courage for fears ever present, Candles of peace for tempest-tossed days, Candles of grace to ease heavy burdens, Candles of love to inspire all my living, Candles that will burn all year long."

"When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,



To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among others, To make music in the heart."





**Appalachia Service Project** is a relationship-building ministry "with construction on the side". Each summer, youth and adults from across the nation participate in **ASP** to make homes warmer, safer and drier. Summer repair projects range from foundations to roofing, flooring to walls and porches and everything in between.

**ASP** addresses basic housing needs in over 30 Central Appalachia communities, but it is much more than a construction program. Faith is put in action while relationships are built with the families we serve, and each another.

## First Bethel's trip will be Sunday, June 17 to Saturday, June 23, 2018

We plan to send 21 volunteers for three work crews (ideally each with 2 adults & 5 youth). Construction experience is welcome but not necessary. Trip cost is approximately \$500 per volunteer, which includes \$325 in direct fees to **ASP** to cover lodging, food, construction materials, project selection, construction guidance, and the **ASP** staff assigned to each summer center.

It takes another \$175 per person for costs of transportation (rental vans and gas), first aid kit contents, basic common tools, safety gear, and other supplies for the work week.

All volunteers must provide a deposit, and commit to helping with the fundraising and preparation activities that make this trip a reality. Adults often choose to provide \$325 to cover their ASP fees, but this is <u>not</u> required. Sponsorships are available, just ask!
