serve on our Annual Conference's Connectional Leadership Table (CLT). This serves as the Annual Conference's Administrative Council. As the CLT prepares to formulate new vision for the Conference, CLT members were asked last week to answer a number of questions and share our answers with the group at large. One of those questions was: "What Makes the WPA Conference Unique?" My brief answer is as follows: "Its geography and culture...both operating in concert with one another. Its culture is rooted in a parochial, Appalachian identity. Its stark foothill geography has helped foster this culture and identity where its hills create pocketed, familial & independent neighborhoods. This provides a unique challenge to unity-building and mutual understanding."

"In a nutshell," I am saying we have specific challenges in Western PA in getting folks to agree on things or getting to the point of agreeing to disagree. Our familial and parochial (insular, localist) culture is partly a by-product of our geography. This impacts our local churches and Conferences as we seek to build consensus on matters pertaining to belief and practice. There is a tendency for each of us to feel our way of belief and practice is the only way that works and the only way that honors God.

Where this trend becomes very apparent is in matters connected to government & politics. As I write this, the first of the debates that will occur during this presidential election season is just hours away. A presidential election season can pull us into pressure cookers of political debate. This season has the potential to foster conflict and harm as it becomes easy to slip into an insular and narrow "State of Mind" (no Billy Joel song for this one!).

In these times, I call us to a "Wesleyan State of Mind" espoused by Bishop Reuben P. Job in his *Three Simple Rules*:

1. Do no harm; 2. Do good; 3. Stay in love with God. As we seek to "do good" and to "do no harm," let us remember that at most times, there is more than one path to a destination. Let us challenge our tendency to think our way is the only way. Attempt to recognize the views from varying perspectives. Seek understanding. May we consider how our differences may be brought together for the collective good. At the same time, think critically. Scrutinize the source(s) of messages you hear. Then formulate your words and actions through the filter of love...the love of God and the love of all God created. If we passionately pursue the third Simple Rule, we will find the first two rules are carried out more easily. Let's pray for one another in this effort.

I am going to start working on a documentary about First Bethel this fall. I am not exactly sure how the video will unfold yet, but I need everyone's help!







For Our Youngest Readers



And so, I sing along."



Friday, September 15 – A Woman of No Importance by Sonia Purnell: The Untold Story of the American Spy Who Helped Win World War II

Based on new and extensive research, Sonia Purnell has for the first time uncovered the full secret life of Virginia Hall--an astounding and inspiring story of heroism, spycraft, resistance,


Spanning the years 1900 to 1977, The Covenant of Water is set in Kerala, on South

India's Malabar Coast, and follows three generations of a family that suffers a peculiar affliction: in every generation, at least one person dies by drowning—and in Kerala, water is everywhere.

At the turn of the century, a twelve-year-old girl from Kerala's long-existing Christian community, grieving the death of her father, is sent by boat to her wedding, where she will meet her forty-year-old husband for the first time. From this unforgettable new beginning, the young girl—and future matriarch, known as Big Ammachi—will witness unthinkable changes over the span of her extraordinary life, full of joy and triumph as well as hardship and loss, her faith and love the only constants.

A shimmering evocation of a bygone India and of the passage of time itself, The Covenant of Water is a hymn to progress in medicine and to human understanding, and a humbling testament to the difficulties undergone by past generations for the sake of those alive today. It is one of the most masterful literary novels published in recent years.

Friday, December 15 – A Life in Light – Mary Pipher



In her luminous new memoir in essays, Mary Pipher-as she did in her New York Times bestseller Women Rowing North-taps into a cultural moment, to offer wisdom, hope, and insight into loss and change. Drawing from her own experiences and expertise as a psychologist specializing in women, trauma, and the effect of our culture on our mental health, she looks inward in A Life in Light to what shaped her as a woman,

one who has experienced darkness throughout her life but was always drawn to the light.

Her plainspoken depictions of her hard childhood and life's difficulties are dappled with moments of joy and revelation, tragedies and ordinary miseries, glimmers and shadow. As a child, she was separated from her parents for long periods. Those separations affected her deeply, but in *A Life in Light* she explores what she's learned about how to balance despair with joy, utilizing and sharing with readers every coping skill she has honed during her lifetime to remind us that there is a silver thread of resilience that flows through all of life, and that despite our despair, the light will return.
