First Bethel is a ministry powerhouse! We carry out at least twenty distinct ministries...ones that change lives locally, regionally, and globally. We are fulfilling Jesus' command to "go out into all the world and make disciples!" And our ministry plans are ambitious as we prepare to set goals for next year!

The dynamic ministry First Bethel is engaged in requires a large number of human resources (approximately 20 employees and dozens of volunteers). It also requires a large amount of monetary resources; approximately \$500,000 annually. It is possible you did not know this, because First Bethel (like most churches) is not communicating its financial position regularly.

Our church's Finance Committee and Church Council have identified the need to establish a method of communication regarding the church's ministries and the resources it requires to carry them out. That will begin with this issue of Kings Light and will be a regular part going forward. Lorna Schlutz has agreed to resume the writing of "Beyond the Plate," a brief ministry newsletter that will be sent to you quarterly. I will send out brief letters and we will schedule dates to have congregational conversation after Sunday worship. It is my plea that you read these pieces of communication. Many, if not most of us, read books regularly that consist of two hundred pages, three hundred pages, or more, reading every single word. Reading a page of information regarding the ministry of the church we love will require a mere fraction of that time and effort.

You may be asking what is precipitating this movement to provide more information? Most importantly, enhanced communication will aid you in connecting to the church more deeply. God is doing great things at First Bethel and that needs shared! Secondly, you need to know the challenges we face in our post-COVID landscape with sustaining the level of our life-changing ministries. And we'll be anxious to share with you the plans that are developing to generate the resources we need to do God's work & will in Bethel Park and beyond ©

OUTREACH

The Parkford Feeding Program has gone very well this year, ending with the school year in August. The meals during the school year are planned and provided by the Department of Agriculture and consist of a serving of meat, vegetables, milk and



perhaps a sweet. We were blessed in this effort to have leadership from Lilly Zeminski, and I suspect she will tell you she had a marvelous serving crew. The suggestion has now been made to include additional dates on weekends to further augment the feeding effort to ensure the kids get warm meals during weekends. The new dates are Saturday, October 28; Saturday, November 25; and Sunday, December 17; and all are planned to be held from 11AM. to 1PM. We will provide a light lunch, a packed bag to take home with non-perishable food items, a craft for the kids to work on, and someone to help with homework, if needed.

Our last Daily Bread date was on October 15, and a hearty 178 meals were served to hungry people. We had some excellent new recruits and spent a busy afternoon serving (and having fun, as well). The new kids knew what they were doing.

Our next Daily Bread will be held on December 10. Please let Sally Irick know if you'd like to share that date with us.

Our Angel Tree will be up by November 12. You will find, as usual, Angels will appear magically on the tree. Those Angels will name Family Links, Kings School Kids, and The Nyadire Connection as our recipients. Each Angel will include a name, the age, sex, and generally will contain three Christmas wishes for us to fulfill. Please know that if you choose an Angel and wish to fulfill all three, that is great; if you wish to fulfill two, that is great; and if you are able to only fulfill one, that also is great. All donations are gratefully received. Some of the wishes may be expensive, so do only what you can. The kids will be grateful for whatever we can provide.

For Family Links, we have found that they have "residential sites". In a residential site, a young adult may need only new bath towels or bed linens or such. If the recipient is a child, we will try to specify what the need may be, given information from Family Links. Young adults may need only new bath towels or sheets for a single bed. Children and Mothers staying in the residential sites may have different needs. We will try to be specific on the Angels.

The gifts for under the Angel Tree need to be back by Sunday December 10. We thank you in advance for willingness to support this Outreach.

Watch for us in the December King's Light for news on our October 22 Trunk or Treat, and for how the October Parkford Outreach feeding program goes on October 28.



We have two beautiful books recently donated to our children's library:






JUST BECAUSE



FOMO

Have you heard of FOMO?

FOMO is the "Fear of Missing Out." For years, I've been hearing about First Bethel's Appalachia Service Project, or ASP, as it's fondly called.



I've seen church members march into the sanctuary with hammers and screwdrivers dressed in jeans, work boots, and ASP t-shirts. I have helped with the Bistro Dinners, given to the ASP construction tree, packed my kids, and put (in one case pushed) them into the van. Upon their return, I heard the laughter of the adults and youth about funny stories, nicknames given, and songs crafted about forgetting your boots and pillow. I have also heard testimonials shared of the lives they have changed and how *their* life has changed. I had a case of FOMO.

I had decided to attend the Adult ASP trip long before I delivered the children's message a few weeks ago about John. John was a big, strong man who was also humble and kind. He was a servant. I referenced Luke 3:16. I shared with the children how to serve God and others by tying shoelaces. It's simple to help a friend so they do not trip while running out to play.

I am not strong like John. I cannot pick up a 6 in x 6 in 12-foot long post like Robert Pugh (thank you!). I may not have the determination like Lisa Pipilo in digging the post holes (she never stopped). I did not possess the ASP knowledge like Lisa DiGorio, Claire Garfold, Lisa McDermot, or Gloria Stephan (I did learn a lot!). But what I did have in common with my team — being a servant. We all served whenever and wherever we needed.



We lent a helping hand to our homeowner, Nina, by finishing up a 6' by 10' porch. This enabled her to have a safe second exit from her house. By building stairs, digging post holes, and adding spindles, she now has a new porch where she can sit out and see the glory of her neighborhood and the mountains in Jonesville, VA.

Nina is a servant herself. Nina joined us for lunch on our first day, sharing stories

about her life and children as we ate our sandwiches outside. On the second day, she stood on the new porch while we dug our holes. The joy she expressed when the steps were done is clearly seen in the pictures. Together - we served each other.



I learned not to be afraid of missing out, but to look at all the ways I can serve God. I realized that I served God by volunteering my time and gifts to teams that have gone before me. I learned I serve God by drilling, digging, and sharing in conversations in Jonesville with Nina. I needed to be reminded that serving God is not just one thing - but everything we do. I encourage all of us to keep looking for ways to serve. No act is too small.
