FROM THE HEART

MONTHLY NEWSLETTER THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR DAVID



"Speak, for your servant is listening," the young Samuel spoke when he heard a voice calling to him while in the care of the priest Eli. But it wasn't the first time God called out to Samuel. The first two times, Samuel thought it was Eli calling out to him. Knowing he had not called to Samuel, Eli discerned that Samuel may be hearing the voice of God. He told Samuel, "If he calls you, say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." The Lord shared many things after Samuel offered himself to God and the unknown author of First Samuel says "The Lord was with Samuel as he grew up, and he let none of Samuel's words fall to the ground." The Lord did great things through Samuel.

Norma Woodward was my "Eli." God began calling my name as my leadership at my home church increased. I began to contemplate a vocational shift but had many questions - even questioning if I was hearing God correctly. One particular Sunday, after leading worship in place of our vacationing pastor, Norma was waiting for me at the rear of the sanctuary. She pulled me aside to say, "you should consider becoming a pastor vocationally." Needless to say, that is what I did - taking my first church in 2007.

My breath was taken away when I recently learned of Norma's tragic death. Losing loved ones is always very hard. Losing those who have been vital to your Christian formation is more difficult. It makes me feel like those Israelites whose world was turned upside when God directed them to return to their home after years of Babylonian exile. All of their traditional elements of comfort and peace had been reduced to rubble and were no

longer present. Home was no longer "home" in the sense they once knew.

Knowing and seeing the fear in their hearts, God spoke messages of hope, promise and encouragement to them through the prophet Isaiah. One of those messages is found in the 40th chapter of Isaiah: He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. (Isaiah 40:29-31)

The day after I learned of Norma's death, I learned from her son that she planned out her funeral service in 2015. Those plans indicated her desire that I officiate the funeral service. Those funeral notes also included the scriptures she wanted read. The first one was Isaiah 40...the one I reference above. Using that scripture, I was able to share about our God that anchors us in life's storms.

Grieving and then pressing into a new normal are very hard processes. It is made easier by a God who uses his people to comfort one another and speak the messages God wants held in our hearts. Many times, Norma was used to be that vessel. I can't wait to see her again...when we are present with the God who now holds Norma in his embrace.


First Bethel Ringers will resume practices every Sunday at 11AM beginning September 14th.. Please contact Christina Ewing if you are interested in joining our bell choir!

OUTREACH



The **Kids Meal Network** ministry at Parkford Apartments started off a little chaotic with food delivery issues the first couple of weeks, but Church Union, First Bethel volunteers and KSK staff all



adapted and adjusted, and we were able to successfully serve over **173 hot lunches** to children this summer.

Thanks to everyone that helped with this endeavor, especially Mary and Ken Courtney and Sally Irick who went over and above multiple times to help to keep the program running smoothly.



Outreach organized a **School Supply Drive** for children residing at Parkford Apartments with a goal of collecting enough supplies to enable 50 children to select items they need to complete their backpacks. The response was overwhelming!

We partnered with Melting Pot Ministries and St. Vincent de Paul and two churches from their parishes, plus Xfinity was there with beverages. There were **74** fully stocked bookbags at the end of the event with supplies left over.

In addition to the school supply drive, we had food, a crafts tent, a pickup soccer game for the kids with some of our older youth participating, and background music provided by our very own pastor, DJ Dave! We were also able to give away books, games and toys to add to the carnival atmosphere.

Sister Rut Scholarship Fund by enabling TNC to receive the Rotary's highest \$5,000 grant. I am asking all of us to consider what "Always Give a Little Extra" means as we approach the October 11th Chicken BBQ.

One last thing: WE ARE PROVIDED FOR SO THAT WE CAN PROVIDE FOR.

Oooooooops - the Chicken goofed. There is another last thing: I left for Nyadire, Zimbabwe on 8/17 and will return on 9/2. I plan to meet up with Tsungi and many of the orphans from the Home of Hope whom I met in 2006, nearly 20 years ago. The kids really grew and matured during my 9 year gap in not flying there. I can honestly say – even though I am writing this prior to my departure - that being there once again made my heart dance with joy. Perhaps the Chicken Dance this year will be exceptional somehow, someway.

BOOK CLUB


Our Book Club explores a variety of literature to expand our understanding and perspectives. Plus, some selections are just for pure enjoyment!
